Background:

#### INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

- Continued partnership with neighbouring municipalities to support the River Route Transit
- Partnered with the UCLG to organize a public information session regarding additional residential units
- Provided donations to the Long-Term Care Facilities Maple View Landings
  Project and Sherwood Park Legacy Project
- Supported the Town of Prescott in the joint application to the Housing-Enabling Water Systems Funding for: expansion of the Prescott wastewater treatment plant, upgrades to the pumping station and forced main to the wastewater treatment plan, and extension of water and sewer mains into Augusta Township
- Provided feedback to the changes to regulations under the Planning Act for the Provincial Policy Statement in relation to Bill 185
- Partnered with MNRF and SNC for additional tree clean up funding and services
- Continuing partnership with the UCLG for child care facilities and the directed growth strategy
- Involved in the UCLG Leeds Grenville Thousand Islands Rideau Lakes 2024 Business Survey – Total of 363 business responded to the survey, with 22 businesses within Edwardsburgh Cardinal
- Provided feedback and a Council resolution regarding the SNC draft wetland mapping in accordance with O. Reg 41-24
- Provided a Council resolution, feedback and consultation with CN Rail regarding the changes to the regulations impacting private crossing upgrades to landowners
- Implemented the South Grenville Police Services Board with Augusta Township and the Town of Prescott

- Coordinated with the UCLG and Township for pre-budget approval received for the installation of pedestrian crossings on various County roads within the Township. To be implemented in 2025
- Submitted a grant application to the Community Sports and Recreation Infrastructure Fund for the rehabilitation of the Cardinal tennis and basketball courts
- Ongoing discussions at both Township and UCLG regarding the Agricultural LEAR consultation process and impacts to lands in the Township

## **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

## **Business Development:**

- As of December 4, 98 building permits have been issued with a total of 117 applied for. 13 of the 98 permits were for new dwelling units either apartments or single-family dwellings
- Approved 1 community improvement project for façade improvements at Speska Holdings
- Supported the extension of the Digital Service Squad program through the Digital Main Street
- Township successfully purchased the Byers Rd property from the UCLG, formally known as the ED19 site
- In partnership with Jule Power, 3 sites have been awarded funding through the EV ChargeON program
- The following site plan and development agreements were entered into with the Township for various commercial and/or industrial projects:
  - Zoning Bylaw Amendment to permit workshop at 921 County Rd 2
  - Site Plan Control Agreement for a commercial business at 161 Shanly Rd
  - Site Plan Control Agreement for Bedrock Depot on County Rd 22
  - Site Plan Control Agreement for Alantra on Newport Drive
  - Site Plan Control Agreement for Johnstown Mini Storage
  - Site Plan Control Agreement for Purplefarm Genetics' expansion

# **Community Development & Engagement:**

- Completed consultation and review for the consent policy for the hydrogeological assessment and terrain analysis implementation policy to streamline planning applications
- Attended the Leeds Grenville Approved Small Business Trade Show
- Held, in partnership with SNCA, the annual community free tree day
- Township partnered with several industrial/commercial businesses to assist in Earth Day clean-up efforts in the Johnstown and Cardinal areas
- Completed some clean-up work for the Cardinal Canal Bank beautification project
- Community Grants & Donations totaled just under \$50,000 including the longterm care home organization donations, plus in-kind support throughout the year to various organizations

- Provided staff support and temporarily closed portions of streets and the arena within Spencerville for the SBCC events – Seasonal Markets, Hoppin Easter, Art Explosion and SpencerWhoville
- Temporarily closed portions of streets within Cardinal for the Cardinal Canada Day and Labour Day events and provided staff support and bleachers
- Temporarily closed portions of streets within Johnstown for the Holiday event
- Port of Johnstown completed the new grain dryer annex expansion project
- Hosted the Tri-Bec inflatables morning for the public at the Cardinal Ingredion Arena
- New pickleball courts in Johnstown completed this summer
- Staff assist in the organization and hosting of the Bait Fuel Bass fishing tournament held at the Cardinal waterfront for the second year in a row
- Provided policy exemptions to the South Grenville Chamber of Commerce and the Porchfest Community Event
